## APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

All matriculating students may apply for financial aid. Students must complete an application and must receive official notification of acceptance into St. Joseph's College to be considered for financial aid.

To be considered for financial aid from government or College sources, the student should follow these procedures **each year**.

1. Complete the U.S. Department of Education Application for Federal Aid (FAFSA) designating St. Joseph's College, Brooklyn, NY, as recipient (USDE CODE 002825), or St. Joseph's College, Patchogue, NY, as recipient (USDE CODE E00505). For further information, visit [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
2. Complete the New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) Application for full-time students. Part-time students should complete the NYS Aid for Part-Time Study (APTS) Application. (TAP CODE 0755 for Brooklyn; TAP CODE 0758 for Long Island.)
3. Complete the SJC Financial Aid Application.
4. Priority for certain financial aid programs will be given to students who adhere to recommended filing dates.

## THE SCHOOL OF PROFESSIONAL AND GRADUATE STUDIES GRANTS

St. Joseph's College offers a limited number of partial tuition grants to full-time matriculated School of Professional and Graduate Studies students. Grant amounts vary according to financial need and available funds. Award determination is made by the Office of Financial Aid.

## THE SCHOOL OF PROFESSIONAL AND GRADUATE STUDIES TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

St. Joseph's College offers a limited number of partial-tuition transfer scholarships to entering matriculated School of Professional and Graduate Studies students. Entering transfer students with a completed associate's degree from selected programs will be considered. Certain conditions apply. Consult your admissions counselor.

## NYPD, FDNY AND NYCDOC PERSONNEL GRANTS

St. Joseph's College will award grants to uniformed, professional, and civilian members of the New York City Police Department, Fire Department of the City of New York and the New York City Department of Correction. Consult an admissions counselor for description and procedures.

<b>FAMILY EDUCATION LOAN PROGRAM STAFFORD &amp; PLUS LOANS</b>	<p><b>Federal Stafford Loans</b> are low interest loans made to students attending school at least half-time. Loans are made by a lender—such as a bank—to help a student pay educational costs.</p> <p>Students must undergo a full federal methodology needs analysis. Financial need is required to qualify for federal interest subsidy. Unsubsidized loans are available to students without financial need.</p> <p>Annual Stafford Loan limits are \$3,500 for first-year students; \$4,500 for second-year students; and \$5,500 per year for undergraduates who have completed two years.</p> <p>Independent undergraduates may borrow additional unsubsidized Stafford Loan funds—up to \$4,000 each year for first- and second-year students and up to \$5,000 each year for students who have completed two years of study.</p> <p><b>Federal Parent Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS).</b> Parents of full-time and half-time undergraduate students may borrow up to the full cost of education less other financial aid. PLUS loans do not qualify for federal interest subsidy.
