### APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Matriculated graduate students may apply for financial aid. To be considered for financial aid, the student should follow these procedures **each year**:

1. Complete the U.S. Department of Education Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) designating St. Joseph's College, Brooklyn, NY, as recipient (USDE CODE 002825) or St. Joseph's College, Patchogue, NY, as recipient (USDE CODE E00505).

2. Complete the SJC Financial Aid Application.
3. Priority for certain financial aid programs will be given to students who adhere to the recommended filing dates:

**Summer entering students, February 25**  
**Fall entering students, March 15**  
**Spring entering students, November 1**  
**Continuing students, April 30**

### SJC ALUMNI GRADUATE AWARDS/GRANTS

<b>FAMILY EDUCATION LOAN PROGRAM STAFFORD LOANS AND GRADUATE PLUS LOANS</b>	<p><b>Federal Stafford Loans</b> are low-interest loans made to students attending school at least halftime. Loans are made by a lender such as a bank to help students pay educational costs.</p> <p>Applicants must complete the FAFSA and a Federal Stafford Loan Application for Federal Stafford Loans, whether subsidized or unsubsidized. Based on the student's financial need and the amount he/she wants to borrow, it is possible for a student to receive a Federal Stafford Loan that is totally subsidized, partially subsidized or totally unsubsidized.</p> <p>Annual Stafford Loan limits are currently \$8,500 for graduate students (subsidized and unsubsidized). Additional unsubsidized Federal Stafford Loan funds are also currently available up to \$10,000 per academic year.</p> <p><b>Federal Graduate Plus Loans.</b> Graduate students may borrow up to the full cost of attendance less other financial aid. PLUS loans do not qualify for federal interest subsidy.
